- For the final, performers must play from memory. There is a free choice of repertoire, except that it must include one Waltz by Chopin (the choice of Waltz is also up to the finalist).
- An original copy of each work to be performed by the finalist must be provided for the Adjudicators.
- Please email full programme information (composers, titles, movements and timings of each piece - maximum 30 minutes in total), enclose your biography and a headshot for the programme.
